Decision

- 1. Mr Jonathan Musavengana is found guilty of infringement of art. 13 (General rules of conduct) and art. 21 (Bribery and corruption) of the FIFA Code of Ethics, in relation to international football matches played in South Africa in 2010.
- 2. Mr Jonathan Musavengana is hereby banned for life from taking part in any kind of football-related activity at national and international level (administrative, sports or any other) as of notification of the present decision, in accordance with art. 6 lit. h) of the FIFA Code of Ethics in conjunction with art. 22 of the FIFA Disciplinary Code.
- 3. Mr Jonathan Musavengana shall pay costs of these proceedings in the amount of CHF 5,000 within 30 days of notification of the present decision. - 4. Mr Jonathan Musavengana shall bear his own legal and other costs incurred in connection with the present proceedings.
- 5. This decision is notified to Mr Jonathan Musavengana. A copy of the decision is sent to the Zimbabwe Football Association. A copy of the decision is also sent to the chief of the investigation, Mr Djimrabaye Bourngar.

Note relating to the terms of the decision:

Pursuant to art. 78 of the FIFA Code of Ethics, the Ethics Committee may decide not to communicate the grounds of a decision and instead communicate only the terms of the decision. The addressee of the decision has ten (10) days from receipt of the terms of the decision to request, in writing, the grounds of the decision. Failure to do so will result in the decision becoming final and binding. A request for the grounds of the decision does not affect the terms of the decision, which come into force as soon as they are communicated (art. 45 par. 1 of the FIFA Code of Ethics).



Note relating to the legal action:

Only the motivated decision can be appealed against to the FIFA Appeal Committee (Article 80 of the FIFA Code of Ethics in conjunction with Articles 119 et seq. of the FIFA Disciplinary Code).
